

Midvale Speed Dome Autotest

1. Entries:

- 1.1. Limited to a maximum of 40 vehicles.
- 1.2. Entry is open but with preference given to participants competing in the club championship.

2. Event details:

This Autotest will be run on a sealed surface of approximately 1200 to 1400 metres in length with no straight section of more than 140 metres in length without a significant change of direction. The course has been designed to test the acceleration, braking, and general manoeuvrability of the vehicle, along with the skill and judgment of the driver.

The Autotest is to be run as per the layout diagram with a maximum of 2 cars on the layout at any time.

Supplementary Regulations

3. Event type, status and dates:

This Autotest will use roads at the Midvale Speed Dome complex and here after referred to as the 'Event'. The Event will run on the date TBA.

4. Authority:

The Event will be held under the Australian Auto-Sport Alliance Pty/Ltd (AASA) National competition rules, these supplementary regulations and any further regulations.

This event will be run under AASA Permit No. AASA000000/MX5WA000

5. Organization:

The event will be organised by the MX5 Club of W.A. Inc.

Safety Officer: Warwick Gates & Don Messenger

Clerk of Course: Warwick Gates

Timing/ Scrutineer: MX5 Club of WA member to be advised.

6. Venue:

The event will be conducted on bitumen at the Midvale Speed Dome. Speed should be kept to a walking pace within the carpark areas. (Approx 10 km/h)

7. Entries:

Entrants must e-mail Motorsport@MX5club.com.au with their name and class to register for the event. On the day of the event, a fully completed and signed entry & scrutineering form must be submitted.

8. Cost:

Cost per entry: to be advised.

9. Licences:

As a minimum, all participants must hold a current Australian Auto- Sport Alliance "Club racing licence" or an AASA approved equivalent competition licence.

10. Program:

The event shall comprise as many runs as we can fit it with your fastest 3 runs counting towards the final placing.

The running order will be as per the entry list.

11. Insurance:

The event permit is effective under the Australian Auto-Sport Alliance Pty/Ltd (AASA). A copy of the terms and conditions are available on the AASA website. The event organisers take no responsibility for a participant's comprehensive and life insurance cover while at the event. It is your responsibility to check with your insurer, as your personal insurance may not be valid.

12. Conditions:

- 12.1. Cars shall compete with windows either fully up or fully down.
- 12.2. Re-fuelling, repairs of vehicles and changing of wheels are preferred to be done on ` cement areas, to protect the bitumen.
- 12.3. A driver whose vehicle has broken down may drive another individual's vehicle, however it must be used for the remainder of the day.
- 12.4. Any vehicle leaking fluids in particular fuel or oil must be removed from any bitumen area immediately.
- 12.5. No competing vehicle may leave the venue during the event without seeking permission from the Clerk of course. Failure to seek permission will result in exclusion from the event. No warm up or cool down outside of the venue is permitted.

13. Classes:

If competitors are unsure what class they fit into they should seek clarification from the motorsport department well before an event.

Class A = Naturally Aspirated MX-5 without ABS, on street tyres.

Class B = Naturally Aspirated MX-5 with ABS, on street tyres.

Class C = MX-5 up to 2000cc Naturally Aspirated on tyres up to and including Toyo R888 medium
Or Forced Induction up to and including Achilles 123's

Class D = Highly modified (Non-OEM major drive line components and/or major weight stripping.

Class N = Non Championship competitor. No points awarded.

Street tyre = tyre with a wear rating of 180 or higher. Note: Achilles 123 tyres are to be classed as an R compound tyre even though they have a 220 wear rating.

14. Vehicle Requirements:

- 14.1. All vehicles competing shall be clean and tidy, road worthy and road registered, unless by prior approval and at the discretion of the organisers, the vehicle may be inspected.
- 14.2. All loose objects must be removed from the vehicle.
- 14.3. We recommend a 1kg or larger fire extinguisher be fitted within easy reach of the driver. Competitors are reminded that the possession and use of Halon/BCF fire extinguishers, other than where specific approval has been given by the E.P.A., is prohibited.
- 14.4. Tyres must be of a type approved for road use (DOT)
- 14.5. Vehicles must comply with the venue/land owners noise requirements and should not exceed 95dB (A) measured at a point 30 metres from the track edge by approved measuring equipment.
- 14.6. Seatbelts must be fitted to the vehicle and must comply with current Australian Standards.

15. Driver Requirements:

- 15.1. Drivers shall wear flame retardant (non-flammable, e.g. cotton) clothing, covering from neck to wrist to ankle (Nylon or synthetic clothing is not permitted) and fully enclosed footwear.
- 15.2. Drivers of cars must wear approved safety helmets. (AS 1698, Snell SA90, BS6658-85, EC22)
- 15.3. Drivers must sign supplied entry/indemnity form and agree to all conditions.

16. Event Layout:

Test markers shall be safety cones.

17. Start and Finish:

To start correctly the vehicle must be stationary, the timing starts when the vehicle crosses the start timing beam. The finish shall be a flying finish.

18. Points:

Each class will get points - 15 for first, 13 for second, 11 for third etc down to 1 and then 1 point for each competitor after that.

19. Penalties:

"Slowest time" will be based on the fastest time set for the challenge multiplied by 1.333

19.1. A "**slowest time**" penalty may be added for each of the following:

- 19.1.1. Driving the wrong way
- 19.1.2. Placing any wheel off the bitumen
- 19.1.3. Reversing after commencing test
- 19.1.4. Vehicles running out of order
- 19.1.5. Hitting any timing gear

19.2. A **penalty of 2 seconds** may be added for each of the following:

- 19.2.1. Hitting a cone
- 19.2.2. Driver unnecessarily delaying event
- 19.2.3. Leaking fluids on bitumen area
- 19.2.4. Prolonged wheel spins

19.3. Behaving in an unsportsmanlike/dangerous manner – disqualification of driver.

20. Protests:

Any protests are to be directed to the clerk of course only and done so in an orderly and polite manner. All protests shall be judged on their merit and the clerk of course has the final say. Any abuse of officials or competitors during the event will result in a 6 second time penalty or possible exclusion from the event.

21. Alcohol and drugs:

Driving under the influence of drugs or alcohol and consumption of alcohol by drivers is forbidden in accordance with NCR and the AASA Anti-Doping Policy. Consumption of alcohol is forbidden until the conclusion of the meeting. The MX5 Club of WA enforces a zero blood alcohol limit and random breath testing may occur at any time on the day. Any Driver found over the zero limit will be asked to leave.

22. Passengers:

Passengers are not permitted.

23. Trophies:

Trophies will be awarded after the conclusion of the club championship.
